## Onyeka & The Academy of the Sun—Tola Okwungu






# The Boy Who Made Everyone Laugh—Helen Ritter


11-year old Billy has a big dream. He dreams of being a stand-up comedian, giving razor sharp punchlines to a captive audience.


## City of Ghosts — Victoria Schwab


## Say Her Name – Juno Dawson

The story of Bod who is raised by ghosts in the graveyard and kept safe from the murderer who offfed the rest of Bod's family.






#### Noughts and Crosses Malorie Blackman

#### Skulduggery Pleasant—Derek Landy




## Night Bus Hero — Onjali Q.Rauf

#### Butter—Eric Lange









How did a boy from Manchester become a footballer and a leading activist in the UK?


