Progress Towards ASTRA Band	This is a teacher judgment on where the student is working relative to the ASTRA
	Expected Band for the subject. Students are assessed as:
	Working Above – producing work to a higher standard than their ASTRA Expected Band
	Working At – working at the level of the ASTRA Expected Band
	Working Towards – working slightly below the expected standard for the ASTRA Expected Band
	<b>Requires Intervention</b> – working significantly below the standard expected for their
	ASTRA Expected Band. Class teachers will provide further information about the
	support being provided.
ASTRA Expected Band	The minimum standard at which the student is anticipated to perform. Bands are
	determined based on tests undertaken in Year 6 and/or Year 7 and use national data to
	predict a most likely outcome for students with similar backgrounds. In order of most to
	least challenging, the bands are:
	Accelerating (equating to GCSE grades 8 & 9)
	Soaring (equating to GCSE grades 6 - 8)
	Tuning (equating to GCSE grades 4 - 6)
	Rising (equating to GCSE grades 2 - 4)
	Acquiring (equating to GCSE grades 1 - 2)
	Students are encouraged to strive beyond their Astra Expected Band.
Attitude to Learning	A teacher judgment of how the student approaches their learning. The categories are:
	Star Learner – actively engages in class activities, attempts Ad Astra tasks, completes
	homework to a high standard
	Motivated Learner – completes all class and homework activities to a good standard
	Reluctant Learner – does not complete class or homework to the best of their ability; can
	be off-task and distracted
