Morocco, July 2023

Following the success of our previous trips with Adventure Lifesigns to Tanzania, Borneo, Kenya, India, Zambia, Uganda and Nepal, we invite you to embark on a new adventure: a 9-day expedition trekking in the Atlas Mountains, Morocco, staying within local communities. We will leave shortly after the end of the GCSE examinations, in early July.

Adventure Lifesigns have a vast wealth of experience taking youth groups on unforgettable journeys around the world. From tropical jungles to high altitude mountaineering – I can guarantee you will discover a new side to your personality that you never knew existed! Our expeditions are not just about having fun, they will also broaden your horizons, can be curriculum supporting and most importantly give something back to the country you visit.

An Adventure Lifesigns programme brings together school teams of eight to twenty individuals, forging friendships that will last for years. In the coming 12 months we will support students on how to fundraise towards the trip. By raising their own funds, they become financially independent and learn the value of budgeting and saving.

Before departure, the team will attend a training course designed to provide the confidence and skills to cope with the rigours of the trek. The trip itself will be split into several distinct phases; carefully designed to maximise personal development and enjoyment.

The projected cost of the trip including all training, in-country costs, group equipment and comprehensive insurance package is £1220.
