Outstanding

The student has an exemplary attitude to learning and;

- Is consistently enthusiastic, interested and motivated
- Contributes fully to lessons, always completing classwork to the best of their ability
- Demonstrates excellent independent learning skills, always completing homework to the best of their ability
- Always brings the correct equipment to lesson
- Takes care to present bookwork to the best of their ability
- Always follows instructions to the best of their ability

Good

The student's attitude to learning supports good progress and;

- Is generally enthusiastic, interested and motivated
- Contributes to lessons, almost always completing classwork to the best of their ability
- Demonstrates good independent learning skills, almost always completing homework to the best of their ability
- Almost always brings the correct equipment to lesson
- Mostly takes care to present bookwork to the best of their ability
- Always tries to follow instructions to the best of their ability

Requires some improvement

The student can display a good attitude to learning but one or more of the following hinder good progress;

- Displays inconsistent concentration and/or motivation
- Is reluctant to contribute to lessons, with inconsistent completion of classwork and standards of work
- Demonstrates limited independent learning skills, often with inconsistent homework completion
- Is not always correctly equipped
- Presentation can lack care
- Instructions aren't regularly followed

Inadequate

The student's attitude is preventing progress, characterised by one or more of the following:

- Lacks concentration, enthusiasm, interest and motivation
- Rarely contributes to lessons, regularly failing to complete classwork to the best of their ability
- Is disruptive, hindering the learning of others
- Can be rude and uncooperative
- Regularly misses homework deadlines
- Regularly lacks the correct equipment in lesson
- Doesn't take care with presentation
- Needs constant instructions and close supervision to stay on task
