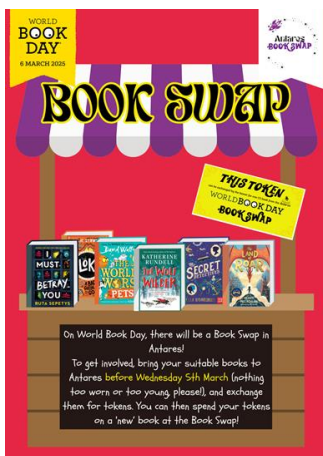
Dear parents and carers

Book Swap

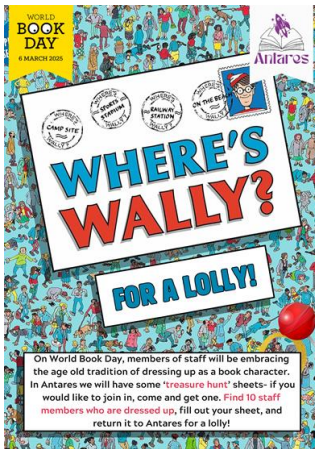

This was a huge success last year with lots of students getting involved and choosing 'new' books and we hope that tomorrow will be just as successful!



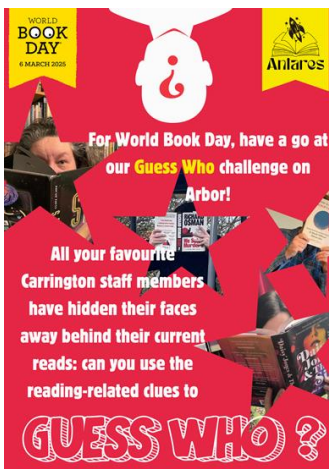
'Where's Wally?' for a Lolly
